We have had our friends and family knitting like crazy and we have managed to collect 1835 big squares, 200 smaller squares, 5 jumpers, 6 hats, 2 scarves, 1 blanket, 2 pairs of gloves and 1 teddy. This is an organisation that collects together squares from all over the world, sews them together and the blankets get distributed to AIDS orphans around Southern Africa. At the moment there is an estimate of over 4million AIDS orphans in the area and this organisation plans to help keep as many as possible warm over the coming harsh winter months.
