## **Happy Puzzle Day**

On Monday 3 February, The Happy Puzzle Company visited Oaklands School. The company uses practical problem solving activities to engage children's interest and challenge them to think creatively and collaboratively.

Four sessions took place throughout the day, involving Transition; a combined Year 1 and 2 group; Years 3 and 4; and Years 5 and 6. We were also fortunate to be able to hold a session with parents after school. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the day and the company certainly proved their message that there are "no impossible Maths problems".

#### Y1 Maths

In Year 1 we try to make maths lessons as practical as we can. This term we have been learning to count in twos and practise the two times table, halve different shapes and double and halve different quantities. We have all worked

really hard on these different topics and enjoyed eating the fruit along the way!









## Y2 Trip to Chigwell Synagogue

Year 2 visited Chigwell Synagogue as part of their topic about Judaism. The children learnt about the Torah and were able to have a close look at it. Rabbi Davis talked to the children and answered their very interesting questions that they had previously prepared in class. This was a great opportunity for us to gain a deeper understanding of the Jewish religion.







#### **ISA London North Cross Country Championships**

On Tuesday 11 February 2014, 15 children selected from Years 3, 4, 5 & 6 travelled to Rushmoor School in Bedford in the school mini bus to participate in the ISA London North Cross Country Championships.

We were very lucky that the rain stopped at lunchtime and the sun shone just as the races began. Each race contained approximately 70-75 runners. Despite the muddy and windy conditions, all the children ran extremely well and didn't fall over!

We await confirmation of the official results but the majority of our runners in each of the races (Y3/4 girls; Y4 boys; Y5/6 girls finished between 30th and 50th.

Monday 10 February saw Year 2 children performing at the Annual Stratford and East London Music Festival. We travelled by school minibus to St Mary's Church, Woodford to compete in the Under 7s Infant Choral Class against five other schools.

We were the fifth choir to sing, so the children had to keep nerves and excitement under control, whilst we watched the other schools perform.





When it was our turn, the Year 2 pupils processed calmly onto the platform and waited for the introduction to our first song: Cockles and Mussels. Singing tunefully and with feeling they told the sad story of Molly Malone and her wheelbarrow of shellfish. The audience applauded appreciatively and we prepared for our second song: Ocean Commotion. Pleading the case of the Hammerhead Shark, the children gave a lively and impressive performance, complete with sharp and effective choreography.

This is only the second time Oaklands has entered the competition and the children are justly proud of their achievement.
