Dear Parents


After many exciting events throughout the School, which you can read about in this newsletter, the Spring Term has now drawn to a close.

The questions were very challenging and covered wide range of topics, but the Oaklands team acquitted themselves well, coming eighth.




World Book Day

The children were able to experience what it would be like to be a real life fire fighter. The children had the opportunity to climb aboard the fire engine and spray water from the hoses.










Netball Squad Bancroft's Tournament
