Art Club (KS1 and KS2)	<p>These two art clubs focus on exploring a range of different media and skills to extend learning in the classroom. Each half term we will explore a different theme or style. Skills will include pottery, painting, drawing, collage, pastel work and sculpture.</p>
Busy Bees	<p>This club for Transition children provides a mixture of art and craft activities together with outdoor activities.</p>
Computing	<p>Computers and technology play an increasingly important role in the world and the aim of Computing Club is to extend pupils computing skills so they can take a more active interest in technology.</p> <p>Some of the activities we will complete include: Pivot Stick Animator, programming, creating and editing text and graphic-based documents, making avatars, designing storyboards and using a range of online problem solving and logic games. The children will also have the opportunity to choose their own computing activities in a controlled environment.</p>

Homework Club	<p>This club takes place twice a week on Tuesday and Thursday. A maximum number of twenty children from Years 2 to 6 are allowed to attend. Teachers support the children in their homework tasks but also encourage them to work independently.</p>
Sports Club	<p>Cross Country, Netball, Athletics, Short Tennis, KS2 Football, Tag Rugby, Cricket, Multi Sports.</p> <p>All these Sports Clubs provide the children with the opportunity to consolidate and further develop the skills they are learning within the PE curriculum. Depending on the age group, the children learn how to use these skills in competitive team situations. In KS2 greater emphasis is gradually placed on developing attacking and defending skills.</p>
Strategy Board Games	<p>Chess, Draughts, Dominoes, Chinese, Chequers and more...</p> <p>At Strategy Board Games, children are encouraged to use their problem solving skills whilst playing a variety of board games.</p>
