## Clubs Run By Oaklands Staff

<b>Art Club KS1 and KS2</b>	These two art clubs focus on exploring a range of different media and skills to extend learning in the classroom. Each half term we will explore a different theme or style. Skills will include pottery, painting, drawing, collage, pastel work and sculpture.
<b>Busy Bees</b>	This club for Transition children provides a mixture of art and craft activities together with outdoor activities.
<b>Computing</b>	<p>Computers and technology play an increasingly important role in the world and the aim of Computing Club is to extend pupils computing skills so they can take a more active interest in technology.</p> <p>Some of the activities we will complete include: Pivot Stick Animator, programming, creating and editing text and graphic-based documents, making avatars, designing storyboards and using a range of online problem solving and logic games.</p> <p>The pupils will also have the opportunity to choose their own computing activities in a controlled environment.</p>
<b>Cookery Club</b>	The Cookery Club is run for pupils in KS1 and KS2 who are interested in developing their cooking ability. It provides opportunities for children to improve their food preparation skills, to follow cooking instructions and how to cook a tasty treat.
<b>Cross Country/Netball/ Athletics/Short Tennis/KS1 &amp; KS2 Football/ Cricket/ Rounders and Multi Sports</b>	All these sports clubs provide the pupils with the opportunity to consolidate and further develop the skills they are learning within the P.E curriculum. Depending on the age group, the children learn how to use these skills in competitive team situations. In KS2 greater emphasis is gradually placed on developing attacking and defending skills.
<b>Dance</b>	Pupils will experience a variety of different styles of dance including jazz, contemporary and street dance. They will have the opportunity to develop their creative dance ideas and follow set routines choreographed by the teacher.

<b>Homework Club</b>	<p>This club takes place twice a week on Tuesday and Thursday. A maximum number of twenty children from years 2-6 are allowed to attend. Teachers support the pupils in their homework tasks but also encourage them to work independently.</p>
<b>Lego</b>	<p>Children will have the opportunity to work independently in pairs and in small groups to use their construction, initiative and problem solving skills at the Lego Club.</p>
<b>Strategy Board Games (including chess, draughts, dominoes and Chinese chequers)</b>	<p>At Strategy Board Games, pupils are encouraged to use their problem solving skills whilst playing a variety of board games.</p>
<b>Wild Woods</b>	<p>This club offers pupils the opportunity to use the outdoors to enhance their learning. Activities may include making mud pies, building a weather station or bird feeders, making kites and planting bulbs, herbs and vegetables.</p>
