This was an excellent experience for our pupils with some fantastic memories made.

The piece has 4 parts, starting with the spinning Earth before moving onto the rainforest. This was followed by the ocean and then Earth spinning again.

The final work was filmed and will be sent into the BBC for a chance to have it played on BBC Radio 3 on Earth Day, and also featured on the BBC Ten Pieces website. Well done to all of the Year 5 children!

### Football
