All the equipment in our rucksack was very useful especially the torches for hiding in caves and binoculars for looking at pterodactyl!


The children's imagination really came to life as they excitedly shared their observations and knowledge with

4Z Art - Ancient Egypt

As part of their Art topic, pupils in 4Z have been learning about how ancient Egyptians used papyrus to make paper. They first learnt about the papyrus plant which is a reed that grows in marshy areas around the Nile River. After examining the characteristic features of Egyptian art, the children proceeded to weave strips of paper to make their own papyrus. These strips were then laid out in two layers, one horizontal and one vertical, and pressed to form a papyrus sheet. Pupils sketched their Egyptian designs and had to use fine paintbrushes for the detailed painting that followed.

Year 5 Visit Pizza Express

The children took a tour of the kitchen and listened carefully to all the important food safety information and found out lots about how to ensure a commercial kitchen is clean and safe. Everyone enjoyed looking in the walk-in freezer!

The children were very excited to learn the exact way the pizzas are made and

everyone had lots of questions about the different ingredients. There was great excitement when the head chef used his enormous paddle to take our pizzas out of the oven. Everyone enjoyed eating their pizza and agreed they were delicious!





Year 6 Anglo-Saxon Workshop

The Year 6 children were fortunate to be part of an Anglo-Saxon workshop called 'Portals to the past', on Friday 14 February 2020. The day was filled with educational information that linked with their History topic.

The day began with a short talk that explored how the Saxons changed the culture of post-Roman Britain, followed by learning more about etiquette and hierarchy of a feast in the Lord's Hall and then they played the Fox and Geese, a Saxon board game as well as trying to solve riddles. The children also had to complete a Saxon quiz and needed no support in finding all the answers. The afternoon session was filled with wonderful information about Saxon weapons and armour and the children ended the day by listening to the story of how the Normans won the Battle of Hastings. This was a day filled with knowledge that they can now apply in their upcoming lessons.

Year 3 recently performed their 'Rainforest' play to the lower school, and, the very next day, to parents. It was a sizeable undertaking with songs, narration, colourful costumes and Oscar worthy acting taking centre stage. The focus was on the rainforest and delicate balance of life within. children created patterns with them or gave them as Valentine gifts to their friends.


A number of children also chose to colour intricate heart pictures - we were very impressed with their neat colouring.

Everything was going very well until the Environment Agency found badger sets in two locations and the teams had to re-plan their routes. The class had a fantastic day and have been excited to share their new knowledge about sewage with their family and the rest of the school.
