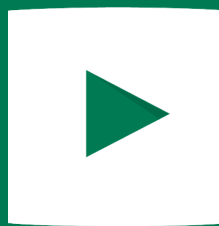

Many children have commented that it is great to have a different activity to do at lunch time as they do not want to play games on the playground every day.



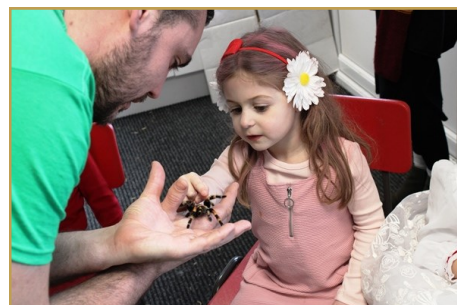
Science Week KS1 and KS2 Mini-Zoo

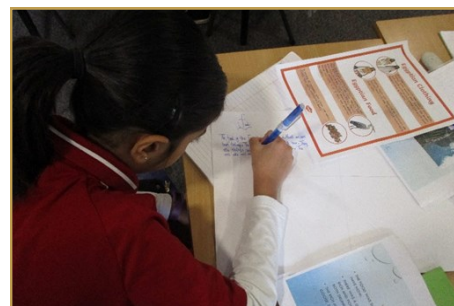

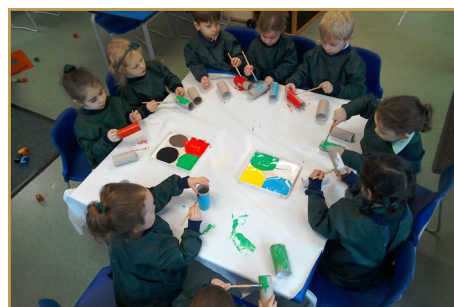
Upper Kindergarten Go on a Bear Hunt
