Year 6 Carnival Masks

about their designs and successfully construct their masks and headdresses. Not only did they enjoy this task, they also gained and developed a variety of new skills.

Lower Kindergarten Activities

The children in Lower Kindergarten have been very busy participating in a variety of activities. The science activity at the water tray was a huge success! Using a plastic cup, the children were introduced to the concept of capacity. We looked at empty, full and half full. They were then asked to see if they could put the same amount of water in both of their cups.

The children have also been learning about sea creatures, including a blue whale, a dolphin and a jellyfish. They were invited to take part in our 'Who Am I' quiz. The children had to listen to three clues and try to guess the sea creature. All the children did extremely well!



Finally, the children were asked to set the table for some important guests! They had to place the plate, cutlery and cups on the table and then pour some water from the jug. This was a great life skill for the children to learn!

Upper Kindergarten Foxes and Rabbits

Upper Kindergarten Foxes and Rabbits have enjoyed being back in the classroom. In Science, they have been learning about forces and weight, and conducted a rainbow paper experiment. In Art, they used forks to make tulip painting and used toy wheels to make some colourful paintings. They also sequenced their school day, made kites to fly outside and proudly showed off their grass heads, which are growing nicely!





Reception Owls

Over the summer term, Reception Owls have been getting up to loads of fun at school and at home! At school, they have been enjoying looking for wild flowers outside in the sunshine, taking part in some fun PE lessons and working hard on their numbers back in the classroom. The children at home are also working hard on their letters and numbers, baking and enjoying the weather by taking their learning outside.

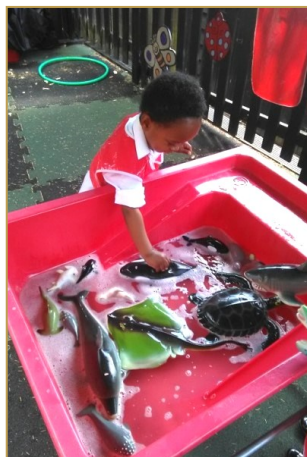

Home learning also afforded an opportunity to explore the different types of volcanoes that exist around the world,



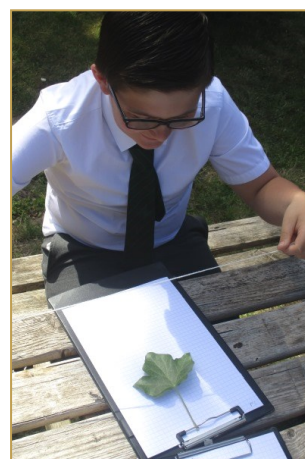
why it is they form and how they function.

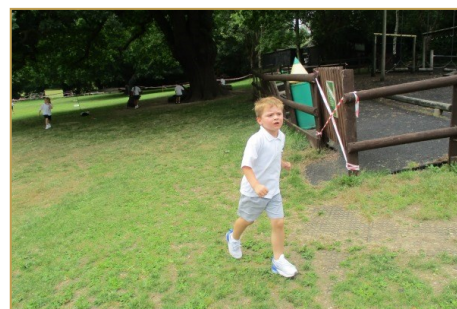


Race to Tokyo Challenge

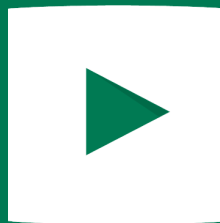
Year 6 Park Keys
