

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Computing Classes



Year 5 have been working hard in English and have used a wide range of literacy devices and techniques to improve their writing. This has included metaphors, personification, onomatopoeia and alliteration. They enjoyed looking at wild animals and produced wonderful pieces of writing to describe the appearance and behaviour of snow leopards in the wild. The children have also been busy expressing their thoughts and feelings through poetry.

They have explored many different forms which have included free verse, sonnets, prose poetry and narrative poems. Pupils particularly enjoyed continuing a poem using the same style as a well-known poet, as well as producing their own poems on Spring time.



Year 5G Art

In our art lessons, Year 5 have been learning about Paul Cezanne.

Using his ideas as inspiration, we have been working on still life drawings. This week, we have been drawing a bowl of fruit.

We have been observing our subjects closely taking note of the measurements and practising our shading skills.



Year 6 - 1960s

Year 6 have been learning about the 1960s. In Design Technology, they have been exploring 1960's convenience food. This week they made smash and compared it to fresh mash potato that they also made. 
World Book Day

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Red Nose Day


On Friday 19 March, pupils at Oaklands School took part in Red Nose Day to help raise funds for Comic Relief.
