Re: October Headmistress's Letter

We are fast approaching the half term break and the children are continuing to work hard in all their lessons. They are always so enthusiastic to tell me about their learning when I informally visit them in their classrooms or when I escort prospective parents around the school for a tour.

A number of children have already been presented with Merit, Good Behaviour or Friendship certificates and all Year 3 pupils were awarded a special Merit Certificate for their outstanding participation and effort during their camping experience during the last two days of the first week of term. Our new arrivals in Reception received 'Settling in' certificates after their first full week of term.

I would like to take this opportunity to offer my congratulations to all the children in the school for starting the new school year with such a positive approach. Well done!

The September Newsletter gave a picture of how much is going on in the school. We have had information events for Upper Kindergarten, Reception, Year 3 and Year 4 parents, a number of Drop-in Sessions for parents to visit their child's classroom, Oak-Tree Group Year 3 camp, House, Sport and School Council meetings, Harvest assemblies and Jeans for Genes day. The extracurricular club programme is underway, which now includes two KS1 Art Clubs and a separate KS1 and KS2 Karate Club.

Open Morning Thursday 7 October

We are hoping for fine weather on Thursday for our Open Morning, which is for both prospective and current parents to view the school at work. Our Year 6 Prefects will act as the official guides and I know they are looking forward to their first public appearance as ambassadors for the School. Their enthusiasm for school life, the articulate way in which they talk about the school, their friendliness and good manners are among the best expressions for what Oaklands School stands for.

As part of our presentation to parents, our Head Boy and Head Girl will be delivering their first public speeches.

Oak-Tree Challenge

Last week Ms Zaidi, one of our Assistant Heads, introduced The Oak-Tree Challenge Scheme to our Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 pupils for this year. This scheme is designed to challenge all of our Oak-Tree Schools' pupils from Year 4 upwards by providing an incentive to participate in the huge variety of opportunities provided inside or outside school. It serves as a vital part of each pupils' personal development and is linked intrinsically to our School Values and SMSC (spiritual, moral, social and cultural) education.

The Oak-Tree Scheme is voluntary and pupil-initiated. Some challenges are achievable in school time; others are designed to be undertaken out of school with parental support. Throughout the nine challenges there are a mixture of skills and activities being assessed, including voluntary work and independent study.

For each stage there is a requirement for self-reflection that is intended to become more detailed as the children get older.

Evidence of the successful completion of challenges will be recorded in a logbook that must be kept up-to-date and completed by the pupils themselves. The supervising teacher, parent or other adult will be countersigning the relevant journal entry to verify the contents.

Bronze and Silver Award certificates will be presented in the final assemblies at the end of the academic year, and Gold Award certificates will be presented at Prize Giving in July 2022. All pupils who gain an award will also receive a pin badge to wear on their lapel. The Awards will be entered onto the pupils' permanent records and may be referred to in future references.

We hope that all children will choose to participate and enjoy the challenges and personal success that they will bring to them.

Achievements outside school

I am very keen to acknowledge and praise your child's successes that they achieve at clubs and activities outside school. Please do send in certificates and badges that I can present to them as part of our assembly programme.

Y1-Y6 Reading resources and Reading Targets

During this academic year, we are continuing to focus on raising the profile of reading in the school.

Some of your children may already have shared with you their enjoyment of their 'Reading for Pleasure' sessions during the week when they are encouraged to read a non-fiction or fiction book or magazine. We have already purchased a selection of multi-cultural resources which are being circulated around the classes; they are proving very popular with the children. We are planning to increase the number of books available to children of all ages on subjects such as equality, Black History, diversity and disability as the year progresses.

Parents of Year 1 to Year 4 children will have noticed that their child has a reading target sheet inside their reading record. These targets are personalised, realistic and achievable for each child within a short space of time. Please remind your child of their current reading target when they are reading aloud to you or enjoying reading a book to themselves at home.

Reading targets for Year 5 and Year 6 pupils can be found in their English book with their writing and comprehension targets.

SMSC Assembly Programme

Since the start of the Autumn Term, our assembly programme has been rich in SMSC (Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural education) and FBV (Fundamental British Values).

My presentation of the School Values included all the areas of SMSC, whilst Jeans for Genes Day and our Harvest celebrations provided the children with the opportunity to reflect on their moral and social responsibility to help people less fortunate than themselves.

Ms Zaidi's WWF assembly, presented with the assistance of our Year 6 House and Vice Captains, captured the attention of all the children as they were faced with the moral dilemma of which endangered animal to choose for the School to adopt. All the Y1 to Y6 children will be involved in a democratic vote before the October half term holiday following presentations by some of our Year 6 pupils on each of the proposed animals.

Admissions Policy

Our Admissions policy is, as always, available for reading on the school website. For those of you with pre-school children, please ensure that you familiarise yourself with the following section about siblings:

'We aim to give the siblings of current pupils at Oaklands priority when considering children applying to join the school from outside. However, admission is not necessarily automatic and siblings are still subject to the school's admissions procedures when applying for all year groups.

The deadline by which time siblings must be registered to join Oaklands in September 2022 is Monday 4 October 2021. We will not be able guarantee siblings' priority consideration if applications are made after this time as the process will have started for those who have already registered to enter the school from outside.'

Parking

As you are aware, the School would like as many parents as possible to use the school car park which is accessible from Warren Hill. In order to facilitate this, may I request that EYFS and KS1 parents collect their children as quickly as possible and then vacant their parking space in the car park. Currently, there are a large number of parents gathering in the car park area or on the grass verges to chat at the end of the school day. This unfortunately means that KS2 parents have nowhere to park when they arrive to collect their children.

As Mr Hagger wrote in his email on Tuesday, Thames Water have closed the High Road outside our bottom gate. Please avoid driving on Albion Hill at least until the end of these roadworks next week as we have seen a huge increase in vehicles circumnavigating the work and driving very quickly past the school main gate.

Supervision

Since the beginning of term, I have noticed that there are a number of smaller children who are being allowed to play unsupervised on the paths and grass banks, climb on the low walls and jump up and down the steps near the main school building whilst parents are waiting for older siblings. For the safety and well-being of the children, it is imperative that parents supervise their children at the end of the school day at all times.

Please also ensure that your child remains with you if you use the path at the perimeter of the field to access the school car park on Warren Hill. This also applies to those of you who collect your children later from an extracurricular club or Tea Time Club. Thank you.
