Re: October Headmistress's Letter

This half term is flying by and we are fast approaching our half term break. It has been wonderful getting to know so many pupils and parents in the past few weeks. The enthusiasm and focus of all our pupils are really quite contagious! There have been many positive comments made by external visitors during the term, including our local ISA representative who was overwhelmed by the wonderful atmosphere of our school.

Our **School Council, Eco Council and Sports Council** have now been elected and those pupils have begun meetings and undertaking new initiatives around the school. They have already generated some very interesting ideas for consideration.

Many pupils have received our Friday 'Congratulations' emails and it has been a pleasure to read them all. Our two Year 3 classes were some of the first pupils this year to receive Merit Certificates for their resilience during the Oak-Tree Camp. They made new friends, put up their own tents and braved, under canvas, one of the coldest nights we have had for several months. Year 1 enjoyed a fascinating trip to Stansted Mountfitchet recently as part of their topic about Castles. Year 3 are very excited about their forthcoming trip to Celtic Harmony in Hertford.

Our new Reception, Lower and Upper Kindergarten children have begun to settle into the rhythm of school life and they have embraced their learning extremely well. I am impressed with how much they have already learnt from our dedicated staff.

I have been impressed with the 'can do' attitude of every one of our pupils since their return in September, their kindness, resilience and excellent attitude to learning is most impressive; they have embraced an 'anything is possible' approach.

Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 have now returned to assembly together on Monday mornings which has freed space for us to reintroduce singing on a Wednesday morning. We are very excited to hear what our newly-formed choir will be performing in the next few weeks.

The September Newsletter gave a picture of how much is going on in school. We have had information events for Lower and Upper Kindergarten, Reception, Year 1 and Year 3 parents, a number of Drop-in Sessions for parents to visit their child's classroom, Oak-Tree Group Year 3 camp, House, Sport and School Council meetings, Harvest assemblies, a visit from Guide Dogs for the Blind and Jeans for Genes day. We also commemorated the life of Queen Elizabeth II in a special assembly following the sad news of her death. The extracurricular club programme is underway, which now includes two Art Clubs and a separate KS1 and KS2 Karate Club. Uniform reminder

As the weather begins to turn colder please ensure that children have coats, hats and gloves in school every day as we will spend as much time as possible outside, unless the weather prevents us. After half term we return to winter uniform for all pupils, please check the website for specific items that need to be worn. All uniform can be purchased from Forest Casuals in Loughton.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you that earrings may only be worn by Years 5 and 6 and should be a small, single plain stud in each ear. Pupils should be able to remove these earrings themselves for PE lessons and I would like to remind you that we cannot take responsibility for any lost jewellery.

Mr Paine has recently written to KS2 parents about PE kit, especially the correct footwear required for lessons. If you have any questions he will be more than happy to answer them, please e-mail apaine@oaklandsschool.co.uk

Can I remind you that items of religious jewellery may be worn to school but must be either removed or covered for PE lessons. The Essex Standing Advisory Council for Religious Education (SACRE) recommends a bandage or sports band to cover religious bracelets to prevent them from getting caught on equipment and causing injury.

Morning work

It might be useful to remind you that all children should arrive at school before 8.45am. It's surprising how much work is done in the first 15 minutes of the school day. This is a time when teachers give feedback and support to individual children and help them complete the next steps in their learning.

Sports events and fixtures

Mr Paine has been very busy diarising sporting events for this academic year. We will write with further information about fixtures this term which include house sports, Oak-Tree and WESSP events for lots of different year groups.

Art

Miss Zaydner, our art coordinator will be entering Oaklands art work into the ISA regional competition later this month. We are hopeful there might be a winner in our midst!

Miss Dee and I will attend the ISA Autumn Study conference later this term. This is an excellent opportunity for us to meet with leadership teams from schools across the country, to share good practice and bring fresh ideas back to school.

Parking

Many of you will have seen me walking up and down Albion Hill, talking to parents and residents this term and in particular dissuading parents from parking dangerously outside school.

We have received numerous complaints from our local residents and, increasingly, from parents with buggies and small children being forced to walk in the road as the pavement is blocked by cars.

Whilst I appreciate that many of you park considerately or walk to school, I am disappointed there is still a small number of parents not stopping or parking with due consideration to our pupils. Whilst I appreciate we all have busy lives, I urge you all to think carefully about the safety of our school community, and the impact fumes from cars so close to school can have on children, and to think about parking near to, or dropping off in our large carpark at the bottom of the school site.

Please support the school by considering our neighbours when journeying to and from school. Do not park on, or across, residents' driveways.
