

# **Lower Kindergarten**

To celebrate World Nursery Rhyme week, the children in Lower Kindergarten have been learning a variety of number rhymes, such as '5 Speckled Frogs', '5 Little Monkeys' and '5 Little Ducks'. These songs allow the children to recite numbers 1-5 and to see that a number changes when something is taken away.

The children participated in a variety of activities, they were able to create either a frog, monkey or duck mask. They decorated their masks using a variety of materials and coloured glue. For our Maths focus, we have been encouraging the children to use the language of size. Looking at 3 different sized ducks, frogs or monkeys, the children were asked to name what size the animal was. Some of the language used was big, small, little, Mummy and Daddy. We also introduced lots of new vocabulary to the children including tiny, medium and ginormous.






#### Year 2Z

It turned out to be full of all sorts of artefacts, including mammoth bones and teeth, and various stone items which had been knapped to form tools.

Year 3 were lucky enough to be joined by a real-life Stone Age character who, despite appearances, was very friendly. He showed the children how to make fire using an improvised bow to create an ember. As this was fairly sophisticated, they were right to guess that their new friend was from the Mesolithic Age. They built dens to keep them dry and found out about the sorts of plants that Stone Age people could have foraged, and those they would have definitely left alone. The children also took part in a hunt, traded, looked at Stone Age tools and even cooked. Everyone had a fantastic time and the site is definitely worth making a visit to if you are in the area.

#### Year 5Z



We celebrated World Space Week in October and all of the children took part in various workshops to extend their learning outside of the classroom. After an entertaining video and discussion, there were so many activities and games to play to build on their knowledge - from play-doh planet modelling, to rocket building with different paper shapes, and even an interactive solar system. Reception and Key stage 1 were visited by Freshwater Theatre Company and used drama to explore various celestial bodies, as well as learn about Neil Armstrong and his journey to the moon. Finally Years 3-6 had an incredible day exploring the solar system in virtual reality with the Education Group. It was a thoroughly entertaining and educational workshop and left the children (and teachers!) buzzing with excitement and awe! It was a week filled with hands-on learning and great fun that will be remembered by everyone involved.
