# **Reception Owls**

Owls have been exploring the properties of 3D shapes. Each pupil was given a different shape and were challenged with putting eyes on the surfaces they believed were faces. Once they had finished, each child shared their shape with the class and received feedback from the other children about whether they agreed with where the eyes had been placed. After a while the children evaluated what they had done and made any changes they now thought necessary.

By the end of the session, Owls understood that curved surfaces did not need eyes as they were not classed as a face.

In PE, Reception have been having fun playing parachute games to help with balance, mobility and hand-eye coordination.



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




#### **1C Perfect Patterns**


1C had a perfect pattern making session on Friday. We have been exploring repeating patterns and learning to identify what would come next in the pattern. The children had a choice of equipment they could choose including beads, 2D shapes, numbers, cubes, pegs, etc. and started by creating their own colour patterns. Their next challenge was to have two rules in their pattern using colour and shape. Their final challenge was to create a pattern with three rules including shape, colour and size.

The children had great fun explaining the rules of their pattern to their friends and trying to complete each other's patterns.



## **1V Repeating Patterns**

Year 1 used a range of manipulatives in mathematics to create their very own repeating patterns. They were able to mix colours, shapes and objects and make it as simple or complicated as they wished.

It can also be seen as a technique of stress relief in a healthy way. Some of our children simply enjoy a moment of quite time where they can express themselves in a creative way.

## **Year 4C Ancient Greece**

Year 4 have started the topic of Ancient Greece. Within their Art, they are looking at the designs, patterns and colours that you would see on a traditional piece of Greek pottery. We had a go at replicating these designs in our sketch books. Can you recognise any of the patterns, events or objects in our designs?















## **Year 5Z Maths Challenge**

Year 5 have been busy working on a range of different Maths challenges

involving time and measurement. The problemsolving activities help children apply their mathematical knowledge and skill. The children are gradually developing a sense of solving reallife problems and applying mathematics to real world situations. It is also being used for a deeper understanding of mathematical concepts within the Year 5 curriculum.





#### **Y6 St Edmunds Taster Day**

Year 6 have just started their new topic for this term on South America. They were tasked with researching five interesting facts as part of their holiday homework. They identified the countries and territories of South America as well as the capital cities. They used their map skills to annotate South American maps. In future lessons, we will be looking at: physical features such as rivers and mountains; human geography such as population and exports as well as cultural aspects such as foods, traditional costumes, languages and festivals.



## **Oak-Tree Maths Challenge**

The first Group event of the year was a huge success! Select pupils from Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 from all four schools in the Oak-Tree Group came together at Braeside School for a competitive Maths Challenge. After settling in and enjoying a few refreshments, it was time for the tournament to start. Year 3 kicked off the proceedings, with three pupils representing their school. They only had a few minutes to complete a mental maths challenge, before clearing the stage to make room for Year 4. Once all of the year groups had their turn, the judges set about marking the papers. It was then time for the second stage of the challenge. In this round, the children's teamwork was put to the test, as they had to work together to complete a series of tricky problems.

After the scores from both stages were added up, it was announced that Coopersale Hall pupils were the overall champions! We can't wait to hold another Maths Challenge next year.
