Upper Kindergarten parents were invited to drop-in sessions this month. The children excitedly and proudly showed their work and enjoyed sharing their achievements with their parents.








Lower Kindergarten

Over the last few weeks the children in Lower Kindergarten have been learning the nursery rhymes 'Hickory Dickory Dock' and 'Incy Wincy Spider'. They have taken part in various activities including creating shape mice, threading around a clock, drawing a spider by themselves and washing the spider away using a spray bottle. They have also learnt some interesting facts, such as not all spiders create webs and that each web is unique and different, just like all of us. Finally, they all made some delicious spider cupcakes, learning that we must follow the recipe to make our cakes.









Upper Kindergarten

The children have also been learning about 'Caring for Themselves'. They started by talking about all the different ways we can take care of ourselves including eating healthy foods, brushing our teeth, washing our hands and exercising. To reinforce heathy eating, the children completed an activity where they looked at foods and decided if they were good for our teeth or not. The children showed a good understanding of which foods are good for us and which are better as treats. We then asked the children to help prepare a healthy snack by each cutting a piece of fruit by themselves. The children tried really hard to use the knife both correctly and safely.







Reception Owls

As part of their dinosaur topic, Owls made 3D dinosaurs using plates and tubes. They chose what colours they wanted to use to paint them and carefully cut out the head and tail from the spare half of the plate – no wastage here!

The finished herd are now plodding slowly along although we are not sure where they are heading.

Owls also learned about feathered dinosaurs, although they need further convincing that birds evolved from the same group of dinosaurs as a t-rex! Two children drew a large scale feathered dinosaur and the class worked together to paint and feather each one.





Reception Robins

As part of their 'Dinosaur' topic, Robins made a mask of a dinosaur that was a herbivore or a carnivore. They had fun acting out as a T-Rex or a triceratops.

Reception Woodpeckers

The children had to pay close attention to the fine details when completing an observational painting of a dinosaur scene. They discussed what they could see from all the different angles. Woodpeckers used water colours to complete the painting taking into consideration how much water they needed and how to blend the colours.





EYFS RSPB Birdwatch

The EYFS department took part in a range of activities as part of RSPB Birdwatch. Everyone completed a bird count both at home and school. Lower and Upper Kindergarten made different types of bird feeders, some of which were hung up at school and others taken home.

They then worked in groups across the age ranges to build a giant birds nest from natural resources. Once the nest was completed, Ms Refalo did a mini drama/movement session with each class/keyworker group which involved the children 'hatching' from eggs before flying off to collect food which they ate on their return to the nest.

It was a lovely, fun collaboration.

















Year 1V

Year 1V and 1C took part in a cross curricular activity and played the role of Sam in 'Sam's Sandwich'. In the book, Sam puts bugs in his sisters sandwich, so the children in Year 1 decided to throw her a tea party to make up for it. In English, they wrote a set of instructions in chronological order and then in DT, each made a healthy sandwich for Samantha. However, they did accidently eat them themselves after... oops!



Year 1C

Year 1 enjoyed a Lego Workshop day in their classrooms, as a fitting end to their *Houses and Homes* topic. The children designed and built houses, remembering to add all the features a house needs such as windows, doors and a roof. There was plenty of discussion about the style of house, whether it was going to be a bungalow or semi-detached; a traditional style or contemporary. The children then added extra details such as chimneys, gardens, trees, play equipment in the gardens and garages. Omi even thought to add a security camera to his house! "This is my best day ever!" said Arya and Emily.



The next stage was to join all the houses together to make a street, then working in pairs or groups to create a town. The children displayed excellent teamwork, planning and building what they thought would be a good addition to their 'town'. We had parks, a river with a bridge, shops, cafes, car parks, a library and even a leisure centre complete with swimming pool!

The children came to school with some amazing creative costumes as they all 'Dressed up for Digits' and then donated their pennies to a very worthwhile cause. The children played lots of fun maths games and problem-solving challenges such as 'Who wants to be a mathionaire?', Fraction Frenzy' and 'Greek Maths'. Year 6 were set the 'Battle of the Robots' challenge where they had to build a robot with a pellet launcher and measure how far it travelled. We converted the measurements from cm to m, worked out the total and the mean; there was only 6cm difference between the top two teams! At lunchtime, the children devoured the beautifully decorated number cakes. 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Year 6G

Year 6 have just started their new topic for this term on South America. They were tasked with researching five interesting facts as part of their holiday homework. This week they identified the countries and territories of South America as well as the capital cities. They used their map skills to annotate their South American maps.

In future lessons, they will be looking at physical features such as rivers and mountains; human geography such as population and exports as well as cultural aspects such as foods, traditional costumes, languages and festivals.



Year 3 St Albans Verulamium

Year 3 recently visited St. Albans Verulamium Museum to look at the exhibits in the gallery, attend a market workshop and marvel at the beautiful mosaic in the grounds. The day began with a visit to mosaic in the grounds of the park. It was hard to believe it was over two thousand years old as the colours were so vibrant. They saw firsthand how the hypocaust (heating system) would have worked. The tunnel where the fire would have been lit by servants was clearly visible, and it was easy to imagine the heat from this spreading under and across the floor. How unusual, then, that wealthy Romans enjoyed underfloor heating two thousand years before we did!

Year 3 also donned authentic costumes and handled everyday objects similar to those that would have been used by Romans all those years ago. They had a fantastic time and the site is definitely worth making a visit to if you are in the area.









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Year 5 Music Lesson

Year 5 had a wonderful music lesson creating a pentatonic tune, using a pentatonic scale based on a Chinese Poem. Pentatonic scales are often used in traditional Chinese music, linking very well with the Chinese New Year celebration. Ethan and his friends had a chance to show the children what a Chinese Dragon looks like.

On Tuesday 7 February Oaklands celebrated Safer Internet Day. The theme was 'Let's talk about it'.
