The children have all returned to school after half-term ready for the next part of their learning journey and it feels incredible that we are now over half way through the academic year. It really has flown by.

11+ Entrance Examinations

For our Year 6 pupils and parents, January and February have been nerve wracking times. From the beginning of the Summer Term of Year 5 through to the Autumn Term of Year 6, the pupils have been working particularly hard preparing for their entrance examinations to a variety of different independent schools. They persevered to complete numerous practice papers, tackling complex sample questions and revisiting areas where they were not 100% secure.

I am delighted to inform you that our pupils have again done extremely well and have all been awarded places at a variety of schools. Many are in the enviable position of having some difficult choices to make as they received a number of offers. The staff and I are extremely proud of them all for their consistent hard work, but also for their caring and supportive attitude towards each other.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff for the excellent standard of teaching they enthusiastically and consistently provide to the pupils and the outstanding pastoral care that surrounds every child and helps maintain the 'family' atmosphere of our school.
