Re: April Headmistress's Letter

I hope you had a lovely Easter break, enjoying the sunshine and longer days. We are looking forward to a busy and productive Summer Term.

Summer Uniform

All children should return to school at the start of the Summer Term wearing their summer uniform. Summer uniform continues to be worn until after October half term. All children with longer hair, as usual, need to have their hair tied back neatly with the school coloured hair accessories. Longer fringes should be clipped or tied back to prevent hair from falling over the eyes whilst children are writing.

There always seems to be some confusion regarding the colour and length of socks that should be worn with the summer uniform so for ease of reference I have included them below:

Lower Kindergarten – Year 6 Girls: plain white ankle socks with no frills or colours

Lower Kindergarten – Year 6 Boys: short grey socks with bottle green hoops (no grey plain socks)

PE (Boys & Girls): short white ankle socks (no trainer socks)

Please continue to adhere to the rule regarding the non-wearing of earrings for all pupils in Lower Kindergarten to Year 4. Year 5 and Year 6 pupils may only wear studded earrings to school on the days when they do not have PE or Games lessons, extra-curricular sporting activities or swimming.

We have had a few very busy weeks with sport in the latter half of this term. On Monday 27 February, we held the annual Oak-Tree Swimming Gala at Loughton Pool and were delighted that Oaklands placed first with 206 points. On Tuesday 28 February, we entered a team for the ISA London North Cross Country at Abbots Hill School and Annabel and Alex in Year 4 qualified for the regional finals in Sheffield, where they competed with some of the ISA schools' finest athletes. A huge well done to both of them! On Friday 3 March the ISA London North Tag-Rugby 7aside tournament took place at Woodford Wells Cricket Club. Oaklands entered 8 children from Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 and we placed third, winning a cup.

On Wednesday 15 and 22 March Year 3 to Year 6 took part in the annual Oaklands House Swimming Gala. Due to pool time restraints, we carried this over two weeks and I am delighted to announce this year's winner was Beech House! Thank you to everyone who came to support us. On Thursday 16 March our team took part in the Forest U9 Football Tournament, we came third and won the plate and finally on Thursday 23 March the Oak-Tree Girls Football took place at Shooters, North Weald our U11 team placed third and our U9 Team placed first.

What a fabulous few weeks of sport for Oaklands School, well done to everyone who took part and to Mr Paine for organising these events.

OPA

Our OPA members were very busy near the end of the Spring Term. On Wednesday 15 March, a long awaited Nearly New School Uniform sale was held in the Year 6 classroom which was very well attended and very helpful to those parents stocking up on summer uniform.

The OPA also organised a visit from the Easter Bunny to Oaklands on Tuesday 21 March, just before the end of the Spring Term. All children were excited to visit the decorated Easter themed studio to receive their Easter gift.

The OPA are now in their busiest term of the school year as the Summer Term includes the Oaklands Summer Fete on Saturday 10 June. The Committee would welcome any parental support available, particularly on the day of the Fete, so please do let your class representative know if you can help on a stall or activity as soon as possible. Parking

Thank you for your continued support in our 3PR parking scheme. We now have the majority of pupils arriving on foot either from the High Road entrance, the main car park or from considerately parked cars on Albion Hill. Please can I take this opportunity to remind you all that you must not pull into or park in the small car park at Oak House on Albion Hill. This is incredibly dangerous.

I would also like to remind you that Summer is the time that many road works will appear in our local area, causing traffic delays. You may need to factor this into your journey to ensure children arrive at school on time. We do still have a few issues with parents parking carelessly and this does cause distress to both residents of Albion Hill and our own parents walking to school. Please try to think of others when parking near school to avoid bringing us into disrepute in the local area.

Class and Sports Teams Photographs

Gem Photography will be taking class and sports teams photographs on **Thursday 27 April.** Weather permitting, they will be taken outside, or alternatively, in the school hall. The photographs will be available for parents to order before the half-term break.

Summer Term Assembly Programme

We always endeavour to make each term's assembly programme rich and varied in order to engage the children, stimulate further discussion and develop their awareness of local, national and international issues and religious and cultural celebrations. We will of course be celebrating the coronation of King Charles in May and will write to you in due course with further details.

PSHE: 'Relationships' Education

During Summer Term 1, the children will be exploring, at an age-appropriate level, the topic of 'Relationships'. For the younger children, this will involve looking at family life, friendships and how to be a good friend. In the older year groups, areas such as developing positive relationships, building self-esteem, developing social skills, managing feelings of love and loss, using technology safely and how to reduce screen time will be included.

Summer Term 2, will see us discuss the topic, 'Changing Me', again in an age appropriate way. We will write to certain year groups after the Easter break with more details and of course, parents are always welcome to view our teaching materials, for this topic, ahead of the lessons. I am sure the children will participate in a number of meaningful and reflective discussions with their peers and class teacher during both of these topics.
