Re: October 2023 Headmistress's Letter

This half-term is flying by and we are fast approaching our half-term break. What a busy start to the academic year. The children have all settled back well into the routine of school life.

Our School Council, Eco and Sports teams have now been elected and those pupils have begun meetings and are undertaking initiatives around the school. They have already generated some very interesting ideas for consideration.

Many pupils have received our Friday 'Congratulations' emails and it has been a pleasure to read them all. Our two Year 3 classes were extremely proud of themselves for demonstrating resilience during the Oak-Tree Camp. They made new friends, put up their own tents and braved, under canvas, a night in the fields of Oaklands. Year 5 have returned to school full of enthusiasm and with a wonderful attitude to learning and were the first class of the year to receive a Head's Award for their conduct in school. Well done Year 5!

Our new Reception, Lower and Upper Kindergarten children have begun to settle into the rhythms of school life and they have embraced their learning extremely well. I am impressed with how much they have already learnt from our dedicated staff. A huge well done to our Early Years pupils.

I have been impressed with the 'can do' attitude of every one of our pupils since their return in September, their kindness, resilience and excellent attitude to learning is most impressive, they have embraced an 'anything is possible' attitude.

The September Newsletter gave a picture of how much is going on in the school. We have had information events for Lower and Upper Kindergarten, Reception, Year 1 and Year 3 parents, a number of Drop-in Sessions for parents to visit their child's classroom, Oak-Tree Group Year 3 camp, House, Sport and School Council meetings, Harvest assembly with a visit from Tony Miller from the Whitechapel Mission and Jeans for Genes day.

The extra-curricular club programme is underway, which now includes new cookery, theatre and gymnastic clubs which I am delighted so many children are enjoying. Mild Illness and School Attendance

The Government has published some guidance for parents about school attendance if their children are slightly unwell, which is based on advice from Professor Chris Whitty, the Chief Medical Officer, as well as other eminent medical professionals.

The guidance says that it is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above.

The guidance also offers advice for parents whose children may feel anxious about coming to school: guidance on mental health issues affecting a pupil's attendance.

Uniform Reminder

As the weather begins to turn colder please ensure that children have coats, hats and gloves in school every day as we will spend as much time as possible outside unless the weather prevents us. After half term we return to winter uniform for all pupils, please check the website for specific items that need to be worn. All uniform can be purchased from Forest Casuals in Loughton. Can I remind you please that items of religious jewellery may be worn to school but they must be either removed or covered for PE lessons, Essex SACRE recommend a bandage or sports band to cover religious bracelets to prevent them from getting caught on equipment and causing injury.

Morning Work

It might be useful to remind you all that children should arrive at school before 8.45am. It's surprising how much work is done in the first 15 minutes of the school day. This is a time when teachers give feedback and support to individual children and help them complete the next steps in their learning. Arriving on time sets children up for the day ahead.

Sports

Mr Paine has been very busy diarising sporting events for this academic year. We will write with further information about fixtures this term which include house sports, Oak-Tree and WESSP events for lots of different year groups.

Miss Dee and I will attend the ISA Autumn Study conference later this term. This is an excellent opportunity for us to meet with leadership teams from schools across the country, to share good practice and bring fresh ideas back to school.
