Re: December 2023 Headmistress's Letter

Unbelievably, this is my final letter of 2023 to you all. Christmas in now in full swing at Oaklands and it has been a pleasure to welcome our EYFS parents to some of our first performances. Lower Kindergarten performed for the first time for their parents in November. They sang beautifully with the help of the Lower Kindergarten staff and Mrs Rathbone. We enjoyed a wonderful performance by the Reception children of their Christmas Show, which included some amazing singing and dancing, closely followed by Upper Kindergarten entertaining their parents with their Nativity Play. I never under estimate how daunting these first public performances are for our youngest pupils but with the skills, support and encouragement of our talented Early Years teaching team they always do so well. Thank you to all the staff who helped prepare the children for these performances. We have more performances to follow for our Key Stage 1 children and parents and then our Christmas Service for Years 3 -6 at St. Mary's church in Loughton.

As always, the final few weeks of the Autumn term are packed with events, activities and learning so please read through the dates list at the end of this letter and look out for more detailed emails pertaining to some events. We try extremely hard to adhere to the published dates so that parents have as much notice as possible, however, there are occasions that dates may have to alter slightly. We aim to publish any amendments in plenty of time.

Oaklands welcomed many new children into the school in September and I am so happy to see how well they have done in their first term. Having read through the Autumn school reports, there is so much to celebrate in pupils' achievements both inside and outside the classroom, and many encouraging comments about the ongoing personal development of the children. We have also been busy finalising the references for our fantastic Year 6 pupils as they approach a very busy period with entrance examinations for their chosen secondary schools. They have now finished their mock exams and some have sat their first external examination. We wish them all the best of luck in January, they have worked incredibly hard.

We have competed in a range of sporting events and competitions, where our pupils have shown good resilience and dedication in their victories and in their defeats. Well done everyone who took part. I am delighted to announce that this year we have 3 pupils representing Oaklands in the ISA National finals swimming gala at Stratford and next term we have two pupils competing in the ISA National finals for Cross Country. A huge well done to Jude, Sammy, Ethan, Erin and Jimmy! I am also delighted to share that our Girls Football team won the plate in the recent ISA London North competition. A huge thank you to Mr Paine and the staff who support the children at these events.

Christmas Parties

The children at Oaklands are very lucky to have such a supportive OPA who have organised various pantomimes, parties and presents from Father Christmas. Remember that the children can come to school on Monday 11 December in their party clothes for their Christmas discos. Christmas jumper day takes place on Wednesday 13 December, please ensure children are wearing sensible shoes and have their coat, hat and gloves as they will still be going out to play! Fireworks

Thank you to everyone who helped at and attended our annual fireworks display. This was a wonderful community event involving all four of the Oak-Tree Schools. It was super to have performances from all 4 of our schools showcasing their talents on the stage and wonderful to see families across all of our schools coming together at one event.

Anti-Bullying Week

November 13-17 saw Oaklands and many other schools around the country take part in Anti-bullying week. We began with an assembly with activities in class throughout the week to highlight what bullying is and who to tell. Bullying is never acceptable and we aim to create a culture where staff are vigilant and children have the confidence to tell us when things go wrong. Parking

Thank you to everyone who has helped support our 3PR parking initiative this half term. I never under estimate how busy the morning drop-off, sometimes of multiple children, to different schools can be. The element of competition has really helped and I feel we have made Albion Hill a safer road to walk to school. However, we do still have several parents parking across driveways, or double parking on Albion Park. Please remember, when parking that emergency vehicles need to be able to move freely up and down the road. Please also remember it is never acceptable to stop or park on the Zig Zags painted outside the school or engage in disputes with our residents.

Site Security

As most of you will already have seen, our car park and side gate now lock automatically at 9am and are scheduled to reopen at 2.30 pm. If you are ever in the car park after 9 am and need to exit please use the green push button located on the final stretch to the exit. During the school day we request that parents either buzz the car park gates for entry or enter school from Albion Hill. The front door of the school and the approach from Albion Hill is covered by CCTV, along with many other areas of the site.

Mornings in School

We have a flexible drop off procedure in the morning between 8.25 and 8.45am. Please rest assured there are always activities taking place from 8.25am where children can do warm up activities for the lesson ahead, change their reading books and sometimes go through their response to marking activities with teachers and TA's. The children are always purposefully deployed as soon as they arrive in school.
