Thank you to all our Reading Ambassadors who have been reading stories to different classes in the morning, break and lunch time. We love reading at Oaklands.




Our House Badges

Lower Kindergarten

The children in Lower Kindergarten have been learning about 'Winter'. They loved exploring our ice and shaving foam 'snow' sensory tray. It was a great opportunity to encourage the children to use descriptive language to describe the different textures. Some of the descriptions used by the children were, "The snows going to melt in my hand", "It's like an ice cave" and "Penguins getting stuck".





They also made some delicious Snowy Rocky Road. The children had to first take it in turns to break the biscuits, by using a rolling pin. They then helped to mix the biscuits, raisins and apricots, with the melted chocolate, golden syrup and butter. Once all the ingredients were mixed together, we put the mixture into a tin and placed it in the fridge. The children were very excited to take their Rocky Road home.





Upper Kindergarten

Upper Kindergarten had a special visitor on Tuesday. Dr Tharma came into class to talk to the children about being a doctor and how we can take care of our bodies. Dr Tharma explained how important it is to eat healthy foods, exercise, get plenty of sleep and drink lots of water. However, we had one child who said he doesn't like water but loves apple juice.

Year 1V






Year 1C

Finally, we chose a template of a winter image and wrote our own shape poems. The children came up with some lovely phrases and some even managed to get a simile or alliteration in their poem!







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Year 2Z

This week in Maths 2Z have been learning all about different 3D shapes. 2Z used pens to draw on mini 3D shapes to help them identify all of the properties correctly, including the faces, edges and vertices. They even learnt about the difference between a 'vertex' and an 'apex'. Well done, 2Z!





Year 2S

Year 2 have been learning all about The British Isles and the different countries that make up the U.K. The children have learnt the names of the countries, the most famous sites and landmarks as well as the different types of food.



Year 3CA

Year 3CA are looking at how Jesus performed 'miracles'. This week we told the story of Jesus giving back the sight of a blind man and how it could be a miracle. We put ourselves in the shoes of a blind person by being blindfolded, drawing a picture following clear and concise instructions.





Year 3CO

3CO have been exploring how to create tints, tones and shades in Art. They really enjoyed exploring the various colours they created through mixing and improved their knowledge of the colour wheel.





Year 4 The Globe Theatre Visit

Year 4 recently had the exciting opportunity to visit the Globe Theatre on London's South Bank, as part of their Topic - The Tudors. The children were only too keen to reduce their carbon footprint by travelling on the underground. Arriving at the Globe, they learnt all about the history of the theatre, and even got the chance to stand on the famous stage. They learnt that the theatre we see today is a recreation of one that was first built in 1599 to entertain an audience of four thousand people. Originally, no actresses performed at The Globe Theatre, or indeed at any other theatre. All of the female roles were performed by young boys. Thankfully, times have changed and we can now play any role we choose. As well as touring the theatre, Year 4 learnt new and exciting skills in a drama workshop and had fun identifying London landmarks as they walked across the Millennium Bridge.













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Reception Construction Club

Reception had an amazing time constructing in both 2D and 3D. They used modelling dough to join wooden cocktail sticks and let their imagination run wild! Some of the 3D models proved tricky to construct but the children showed great perseverance, resilience and independence! It was lovely to see the children so engrossed as they built.

There was an impressive range of creations including mini umbrellas, boats with decks, houses, candyfloss and a hedgehog. As it was impossible to take them home due to their fragility, parents were invited in at the end of the club to enable the children to show off their fantastic creations. Well done Reception.



Wild Woods Club

Last half term at Wild Woods discovered how animals and plants behave as autumn turned to winter. With the beautiful autumn colours we made leaf kebabs, bracelets and matched leaf silhouettes along a trail. We improved our bug hotel ready for the insects to over winter in, played migration games and made nests and bird feeders for our feathered friends. We always have time for wild play with the mud kitchen always out and then rotate activities such as low ropes course, a rope swing and den building. It's great to see the children working and playing together! We introduced the fire circle and this term have been having campfires every week, provide hot water bottles (if needed) and play lots of running around games to ensure everyone stays warm. Wild Woods is muddy! so please ensure your child has wellies and either waterproof trousers / puddle suit / old tracksuit bottoms. The first green shoots are emerging and the birds are singing - before we know it it will be Spring!
