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Early Years

Lower Kindergarten Animal Groups

Year 1C Self Portraits

The children were encouraged to look closely at the shape of their faces, the position of their eyes, nose and mouth and then we looked at all those parts which make us so unique; our hair, freckles, our eyebrows, eyelashes, the shape of our lips, etc. We spent a long time just looking at ourselves and really drawing what we could see.

Pupils selected items, taking it in turns to create and build infrastructure and transportation they are proud of. During the lesson, the children tasted chocolate and focused on their five senses; describing the taste, smell, feel of it in our fingers, the sound of the snap and what it looked like.














Key Stage 2 continued


Year 4C Jigsaw
