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Early Years

Lower Kindergarten

As part of our 'Know Yourself, Grow Yourself' Children's Mental Health Week. Lower Kindergarten designed their own pots ready to plant watercress seeds to grow their 'hair'. They decorated their pot by painting it in the colour of their choice. Once dry they screwed up some blue paper towels into a ball to push to the bottom of their pots. The children then soaked cotton wool in water and placed on top of the blue paper towel. Finally, they sprinkled the seeds on top of the cotton wool.









Lower Kindergarten came to school dressed with a number on their clothes to support NSPCC Number Day. In class they participated in a number of activities, including rolling a large dice and finding the correct number on the chair and for Expressive Arts they used different size circles and dipped them in paint to create dots over their paper.









Upper Kindergarten

The children in Upper Kindergarten have been learning all about the police. They were very excited to meet PC Harrison, who spoke to the children about how a police officer helps others. They also had the opportunity to sit inside a real police car and try on some police uniforms.

During our Wild Woods session, the children pretended to be police officers and searched for the missing animals. They had to listen to the clues and use their magnifying glass or binoculars to find the animals. They had lots of fun!







Reception Owls

Early Years continued

Reception Robins

In Robins we have been exploring extreme weather, looking closely at floods, droughts, wildfires and tornadoes. The children drew on their understanding of water from last week's focus story 'Once upon a raindrop', particularly when learning about floods and droughts. The children enjoyed looking at various pictures and showed great concern for the dangers posed by such extreme weather.







Reception Woodpeckers

Reception have been exploring extreme weather so we have had a 'Weather channel' roleplay area in Woodpeckers. The children were able to use the different props provided and share the upcoming forecast. They used all of the correct language and even shared that a flood was coming to Loughton!













Year 1C

1C have been measuring and learning all about longer or shorter. The children had to measure the small world animals using various non-standard items such as cubes, paperclips and multi-link. They chatted about which animals were taller or shorter and which ones were longer or shorter. The children worked in pairs and on their own to measure and compare animals. They then used a ruler to measure 'chocolate bars' in centimetres and order them shortest to longest.





Year 1W

The Bright Lights and Big City of London has captured the fascination of class 1W!

The children have been looking at London landmarks, drawing from their word bank, Humanities knowledge and trip to the London Eye to detail London in a travel brochure. The pupils talked about their *Top Tips, Foods to Try* and *Things to Do*. One of their favourite facts is that the London underground is one of the biggest and largest public transports in the world. Well done all of class 1W for your hard work!





Year 2S

In R.E the children in 2S have been learning about the Islam religion and the different times of the day Muslims pray. They have designed prayer mats and written their own prayers.





Year 2Z

2Z had lots of fun creating salt paintings in Art. They made their designs using PVA glue and covered them with salt. They then used watercolours to paint them and watched amazed as the paint spread magically through the salt. Well done, 2Z!









Year 3C

Year 3 have been looking at the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in AD 79. They have turned on their newspaper reporter hats and have been writing a report about that fateful day in Pompeii. They have learnt about how to use time connectives, writing in chronological order and including capital letters for proper nouns, all whilst writing in the past tense!







Year 3V

In Year 3, the children have been learning about length and perimeter, including how to convert between different units of measurement, such as millimetres, centimetres, and metres. They discussed which units are most appropriate for measuring different objects and placed various measurements in ascending order. The children also learned how to calculate the perimeter of shapes accurately, linking this to their knowledge of shape properties.





Year 4C

Year 4 were very excited to present their assembly to Year 2 and their partner class and the very next day, to parents. It was a sizeable undertaking with Greek Gods, Olympic athletes, singing and dancing, with an appearance from the venerable story teller Aesop, himself. The focus was a snapshot of life in Ancient Greece. Aside from the fun of dress rehearsals, the play touched on some of the aspects and key beliefs of life in Ancient Greece. The children rose to the challenge, supporting one another to deliver a polished performance that showcased their learning. Well done Year 4!













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Year 4D

During Children's Mental Health Week, Year 4 explored the theme *Know Yourself*, *Grow Yourself*. To symbolise their personal growth the children planted and nurtured their own pots of cress, watching them flourish just as they do in their own journeys.

Throughout the week, they engaged in thoughtful activities to help them understand their emotions and develop strategies to manage them. From recognising different feelings to learning ways to overcome challenges, the children reflected on the importance of self-care and resilience.











In class the children have been celebrating some fantastic achievements in 4D! The children in 4D took part in an exciting debating lesson, inspired by our class book *The Ice Palace* by Robert Swindells. The big question up for discussion was: **Should Ivan go on his adventure to rescue his little brother?**

The children embraced their roles as debaters, presenting well-thought-out arguments for both sides. Some passionately argued that Ivan should embark on his journey, highlighting his bravery and determination to save his brother. Others countered with concerns about the dangers he might face, questioning whether the risks outweighed the rewards.

It was fantastic to see the children developing their speaking and listening skills, confidently expressing their ideas and responding to opposing views with respect. They thoroughly enjoyed the challenge and showed great enthusiasm for the debate—who knows, we may have some future politicians in the making!





Year 5Z

As part of their PSHE topic, Dreams and Goals, Year 5 have been exploring different job opportunities available to people. They have shared their future aspirations with the class and considered the skills and experience they might need. The children explained why they valued and appreciated the contributions made by people in different jobs. They particularly enjoyed taking part in job interviews in class. The pupils will also be considering how their dreams and goals may be different to children in other parts of the world.







In Year 5, the children have also been putting their reporter hats on and getting creative with some very exciting newspaper articles! This term, they've been diving into *The Iron Man*, and the children have been hard at work uncovering all the key features of a top-notch article. They used this knowledge to write their own stories, showcasing their amazing skills as journalists.



The children have also been enjoying pottery lessons with Mrs Ahmed where they have learned a new skill and made and decorated some beautiful bowls. Year 5 have been very busy recently!









Year 6M

Year 6 have created some amazing geometric patterns in Maths, ready to go on display. We created these with only a protractor, working out different factors of 360 and then measuring extremely carefully. Some of us kept it simple but some of us drew intricate designs by measuring every 10 degrees. They turned out beautifully and they all enjoyed the lesson.







Specialist Lessons

Science

Year 1 have been learning about the weather and have been investigating shadows. They discussed which weather allows shadows to form and investigated how shadows change throughout the day using torches and shadow puppets. The children realised that the shadows changed size at different times of day and also appeared on the opposite side from morning to afternoon.













Year 1 have also been learning about the seasons and our weather, this included them looking for signs that certain weather is coming, such as a storm. To help with their weather watching skills, the classes made Breeze Buddies, who will wave around to show that the wind is picking up, this could be a sign that the weather is about to get cold or even that a storm is coming. 1W also found some time to take their Breeze Buddies outside and see if they could get them moving.







Year 2 have been investigating what is meant by the term waterproof. The children predicted which materials they thought might be waterproof before testing them. They then investigated how a wax crayon could be used to make paper waterproof!

It has become a yearly event for the KS2 choir to enter this fabulous competition. The choir, made up of over 35 members from Years 3-6, travelled to St Mary's in South Woodford on Monday 10 February to compete against seven other schools for a much coveted trophy. 
Year 5 and 6 Young Voices



Number Day

















Children came to school dressed as either rock stars or in outfits featuring their favourite numbers, adding a lively, colourful atmosphere to the day.


